Se divide en diez unidades temáticas, cada una de las cuales incluye una completa lista de términos con su correspondiente traducción en inglés, acompañadas de oraciones en ambos idiomas. Asimismo, se incluye la transcripción fonética de todas las entradas según el Alfabeto Fonético Internacional (AFI).

affable / good-natured

agobiado/a *adj* • ayoβjaðos

overwhelmed / weighed down

Los empleados se sentían agobiados por las exigencias de su trabajo. ► The employees felt overwhelmed by the demands of their job.

alabar *v* • alaβar

to praise

Nos alabaron por nuestro esfuerzo. ► We were praised for our effort.

alocado/a *adj* • alokaðo

crazy / zany

Cuando era joven, era una chica bastante alocada. ► When I was young, I was a pretty crazy girl.

amargado/a *adj* • amaryaðo

bitter

Mi tío es una persona rara y amargada. ► My uncle is a strange and bitter person.

animado/a *adj* • animaðo

cheerful / lively

Hoy no pareces tan animado como ayer, ¿te encuentras bien? ► Today you don't look as lively as yesterday, ¿are you alright?

apacible *adj* • apaθiβle, apasiβle

calm

María es una chica apacible y amable. ► María is a calm and kind person.

aprensivo/a *adj* • aprensiβo

apprehensive / hypochondriac

Es tan aprensiva que va al médico cada semana. ► She is so hypochondriac that she goes to the doctor every week.

astucia *n, f* • astuθja, astusja

astuteness / cleverness / cunning

Él tenía fe en su astucia y estaba seguro de que encontraría al ave. ► He had faith in his cunning and was certain he'd find the bird.

astuto/a *adj* • astuto

clever / cunning / sly

Él es astuto y manipulador. ► He's cunning and manipulative.

asustar *v* • asustar

to scare

No queremos asustar a los niños. ► We don't want to scare the children away.

atento/a *adj* • atento

attentive / watchful

Me pide que esté atento. ► He asks me to be attentive.

avaricia *n, f* • aβariθja, aβarisja

greed

Aunque tenía muchos juguetes, su avaricia le hizo querer más. ► Although he had many toys, his greed made him want more.

avaro *adj* • aβaro

greedy

Es avaro y vago. ► He's greedy and lazy.

benevolencia *n, f* • beneβolenθja, beneβolensja **benevolence / kindness**

Tu benevolencia me sobrecoge. ► Your kindness overwhelms me.

bondad *n, f* • bondað

goodness / kindness

Quiero expresar mi más profundo agradecimiento por su bondad. ► I wish to express my deep appreciation for your kindness.

bondadoso/a *adj* • bondaðoso

kind-hearted

Mi abuela era una mujer bondadosa que ayudaba a todo el mundo. ► My grandmother was a kind-hearted woman who helped everybody.

cabezonería *n, f* • kaβeθonərIa, kaβesonərIa

stubbornness

¡No aguento tu cabezonería! ► I can't stand your stubbornness!

cabezota *adj* • kaβeθota, kaβesota

stubborn

Mary es demasiado cabezota para disculparse. ► Mary is too stubborn to apologize.

cálido/a *adj* • kAlido

warm-hearted

Mary es una persona cálida y bondadosa. ► Mary is a warm-hearted, caring person.

callado/a *adj* • kaʎaðo

quiet

Si yo fuera vos, me quedaría callado. ► If I were you, I would stay quiet.

campechano/a *adj* • kampetʃano

cheerful

Aunque es un hombre rico y poderoso, es muy campechano. ▶ In spite of being a rich and powerful man, he is quite cheerful.

caradura *adj* • karaðura

bare faced / cheeky

¿Cómo puedes ser tan caradura? ▶ How can you be so cheeky?

cariñoso/a *adj* • karijnosa

loving

Es agradable ver a una cariñosa pareja de ancianos. ▶ It is pleasant to watch a loving old couple.

carisma *n, m* • karizma

charisma

Lo que le falta en carisma, ella lo compensa con trabajo duro. ▶ What she lacks in charisma, she makes up for with hard work.

carismático/a *adj* • karizmAtiko

charismatic

Nuestra profesora de historia es una mujer carismática. ▶ Our history teacher is a charismatic woman.

chismorrear *v* • ʃizmorear

to gossip

Dejen de chismorrear. ▶ Stop gossiping.

chismoso/a *adj* • ʃizmoso

gossip / nosy

Tu amigo es un chismoso, siempre me pregunta por mi vida privada. ▶ Your friend is nosy, he's always asking about my private life.

cobarde *adj* • koβarðe

coward

Él no es más que un cobarde. ▶ He is nothing more than a coward.

cobardía *n, f* • koβarðIa

cowardice

Le acusaron de cobardía por no enfrentarse a su rival. ► He was accused of cowardice for not confronting his rival.

complacencia *n, f* • komplaθenθja, komplasensja

satisfaction

Su cara mostraba complacencia. ► Her face showed satisfaction.

complacer *v* • komplaθer, komplaser

to please

Nos resulta difícil llevarnos bien con ella porque es difícil de complacer. ► It is difficult for us to get along with her, because she is hard to please.

complaciente *adj* • komplaθjente, komplasjente

indulgent / pleasant

No seas tan complaciente con nuestros hijos. ► Don't be so indulgent with our children.

comprensivo/a *adj* • komprensiθo

sympathetic / understanding

Pedro es muy comprensivo. ► Pedro is very understanding.

confiado/a *adj* • komfjaðo

confident / trusting

Si crees en lo que te dijo, eres demasiado confiada. ► If you believe in what he said, you're too trusting.

confiar *v* • komflar

to trust

Diga lo que diga, no confíes en él. ► No matter what he may say, don't trust him.

cordial *adj* • korðjal

friendly / warm

Manteniendo una charla con él, lo encontré inquieto pero cordial. ► On hav-

ing a talk with him, I found him troubled but friendly.

cotilla *adj* • kotiña

nosy

No seas cotilla. ► Stop being nosy.

cuentista *adj* • kwentista

liar / tattletale

No te creo, eres un cuentista. ► I don't believe you, you're a liar.

descarado/a *adj* • deskaraðo

shameless

Su comportamiento fue tan descarado que nos quedamos en silencio. ► Her behavior was so shameless that we kept silent.

desconfiado/a *adj* • deskomfjaðo

distrustful / suspicious

Tal vez yo no debería ser tan desconfiado. ► Maybe I shouldn't be so suspicious.

desengaño *n, m* • desengajo

disenchantment / disillusion

El desengaño con la situación política es más que evidente. ► The disenchantment with the political situation is rather obvious.

desilusionado/a *adj* • desilusjonaðo

disappointed / disillusioned

Pareces muy desilusionado con el resultado. ► You look very disappointed at the result.

detestar *v* • detestar

to hate

Él detesta ir al colegio. ► He hates going to school.

dicharachero/a *adj* • ditfaratfero

talkative

¡Qué chica tan dicharachera! ▶ What a talkative girl!

educado/a *adj* • eðukaðo

polite

Tony es un chico educado. ▶ Tony is a polite boy.

elocuente *adj* • elokwente

eloquent

Su discurso es muy elocuente. ▶ His speech is very eloquent.

elogio *n, m* • eloðjo

praise

Tu esfuerzo merece elogio. ▶ Your effort deserves praise.

empecinado/a *adj* • empeθinaðo, empesinaðo

stubborn

Estás empecinado, no es posible que cambies de idea. ▶ You're stubborn, it's not possible to change your mind.

empecinarse *v* • empeθinarse, empesinarse

to insist

Te empecinaste en salir y ahora estás enferma. ▶ You insisted on going out and now you're ill.

empeñarse *v* • empeñarse

to insist

Se empeñó en hablar con el director y al final lo consiguió. ▶ He insisted on talking to the director and eventually he got it.

entregado/a *adj* • entreyáðo

dedicated

Estoy entregada a mi trabajo. ▶ I'm a dedicated worker.

entusiasmarse *v* • entusjazmarse

to be thrilled

Nos entusiasmó su discurso. ▶ We were thrilled by her speech.

entusiasta *adj* • entusjasta

enthusiast / keen

Es un entusiasta del teatro. ▶ He is a theater enthusiast.

envidioso/a *adj* • embiðjoso

jealous

Si eres tan envidiosa, tendrás problemas en tu relación. ▶ If you're so jealous, you'll have problems in your relationship.

equivocado/a *adj* • ekiðsókaðo

wrong

Todos dijeron que yo estaba equivocado. ▶ Everyone said that I was wrong.

escrupuloso/a *adj* • eskrupuloso

fussy

Eres muy escrupulosa con la limpieza. ▶ You're very fussy with the cleaning.

expresivo/a *adj* • ekspresiðo

expressive

Ella es tan expresiva que puedo entender cómo se siente sin preguntarle. ▶ She is so expressive that I can understand how she feels without asking her.

extrovertido/a *adj* • ekstroþertiðo

extroverted / outgoing

Juan es extrovertido y dicharachero. ▶ Juan is outgoing and talkative.

firmeza *n, f* • firmeða, firmesa

firmness / steadiness

Necesitamos tu firmeza para mantener la clase en orden. ▶ We need your

firmness to keep the class under control.

fisgón/a *adj* • fizyOn

nosy / prying

Mi vecina es una fisgona. ► My neighbor is a nosy person.

fisgonear *v* • fizyonear

to pry

A Ana le gusta fisgonear en la vida de sus compañeros de trabajo. ► Ana likes to pry into her colleagues' lives.

flemático/a *adj* • flemAtiko

phlegmatic

Ernesto tiene un temperamento flemático. ► Ernesto has a phlegmatic temperament.

fracaso *n, m* • frakaso

failure

Su fracaso se debe a su ignorancia. ► His failure is due to his ignorance.

generoso/a *adj* • xeneroso

generous

Él es generoso con sus amigos. ► He is generous to his friends.

genio *n, m* • xenjo

genius

Se le consideraba un genio. ► He was reputed to be a genius.

ignorante *adj* • iynorante

ignorant

Él es el clásico caso de que la gente más ignorante es la más segura de que están en lo correcto. ► He's a classic case that the more ignorant people are the more sure they are that they are correct.

imperturbable *adj* • imperturβaβle

composed

Mi madre estuvo imperturbable incluso en el peor momento. ► My mother was composed even in the worst moment.

imponer *v* • imponer

to impose

En una democracia, no puedes imponer tu voluntad. ► In a democracy, you cannot impose your will.

impulsivo/a *adj* • impulsivo

impulsive

Tom es un poco impulsivo, ¿no? ► Tom is a little impulsive, isn't he?

indiferencia *n, f* • indiferen θ ja, indiferensja

indifference

La indiferencia es un arma de doble filo. ► Indifference is a double-edged weapon.

indignado/a *adj* • indignado

angry / outraged

Me han despedido, ¡estoy indignado! ► I've been fired, I'm outraged!

inexperto/a *adj* • ineksperto

inexperienced

Todavía es un empleado inexperto, necesita tiempo. ► He is still an inexperienced employee, he needs time.

inexpresivo/a *adj* • inekspresivo

expressionless / expressive

¿Siempre ha sido tan inexpresivo? ► Has he always been so inexpressive?

inseguro/a *adj* • insejuro

insecure / unsure

Mi aspecto me hace sentir insegura. ► My look makes me feel insecure.

insensato/a *adj* • insensato

foolish / unwise

Dije algo muy insensato. ► I said a very foolish thing.

insensible *adj* • insensiþle

insensitive

Chris no me gusta porque es muy rudo e insensible. ► I dislike Chris because he is very rude and insensitive.

insistir *v* • insistir

to insist

Si insistes, te diré lo que pienso. ► If you insist, I'll tell you what I think.

intrépido/a *adj* • intrEpiðo

adventurous

Cuando era joven, era muy intrépido. ► When I was young, I was quite adventurous.

introvertido/a *adj* • introþertiðo

introverted

Tom es introvertido y tímido. ► Tom is introverted and shy.

ironía *n, f* • ironIa

irony

Eres el único que no entiende la ironía de mi frase. ► You're the only one who didn't understand the irony of what I said.

joyosal *adj* • xoþjal

cheerful

Me encanta la gente joyosal y sociable. ► I love cheerful and sociable people.

joyosalidad *n, f* • xoþjaliðað

cheerfulness

Su joyosalidad me fascina. ► Her cheerfulness fascinates me.

maldad *n, f* • maldað

nastiness / wickedness

La naturaleza humana es buena y la maldad es esencialmente antinatural. ▶ Human nature is good and wickedness is essentially unnatural.

mezquino/a *adj* • meθkino, meskino

mean

¿Cómo puede ser tan mezquino? ▶ How can he be so mean?

obstinado/a *adj* • oβstinaðo

adamant

Es imposible que hablemos si eres tan obstinada. ▶ It's not possible to talk if you are so adamant.

obstinarse *v* • oβstinarſe

to insist / to persist

¿Por qué te obstinas en hacerlo todo a tu manera? ▶ Why do you insist on doing everything your way?

ocurrente *adj* • okurente

witty

Ella era excepcionalmente ocurrente y encantadora. ▶ She was uncommonly witty and charming.

osadía *n, f* • osaðla

audacity / daring

Tu osadía me sorprende. ▶ Your audacity amazes me.

osado/a *adj* • osaðo

daring

Hay que ser osado para decir algo así. ▶ You have to be daring to say something like that.

osar *v* • osar

to dare

¿Cómo osas hablarme así? ▶ How dare you talk to me like that?

paciencia *n, f* • paθjenθja, pasjensja
